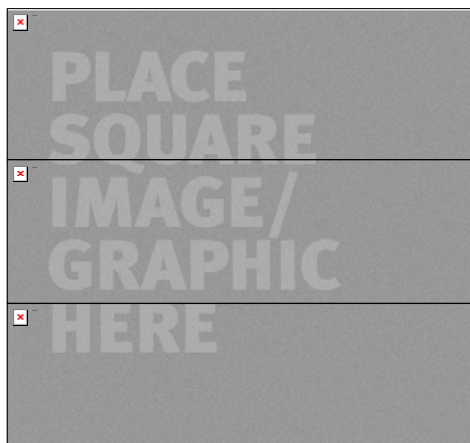

Aviation Security

- Recent audit by ICAO in September 2006, Brunei Darussalam has currently intensified its effort to achieve the full implementation and enforcement of the international protocols on aviation security as well as of the ICAO Standards and Recommended Practices (SARPs) especially those relating to aviation security.
- Brunei International Airport has undertaken additional measures to ensure that security gaps are avoided. We will allocate more security infrastructures as well as more emphasis on air transport security. This would be included in our Airport Master Plan.

ADELAIDE AUSTRALIA 2007

Our current responses to airport security are, namely:-



- We are carrying out one hundred percent security screening of checked baggage;
- We license x-ray screeners to the standard required in the our National Civil Aviation Security Programme in meeting the requirements of Annex 17 to the Convention on International Civil Aviation;
- Security patrols inside the airport terminals, and within the airport vicinity are maintained and increased;
- In addition to X-ray screening, hand-carried luggage and passengers are physically checked;
- Personnel and vehicles accessing the Airport are tightly checked; and
- We are carrying out security checks at the air cargo centre

Maritime Security

- In compliance with the ISPS Code since 01 July 2004, Brunei Darussalam engaged a consultant, among others, to conduct a Port Facility Security Assessment for each port facility within its territory, prepare Port Facility Security Plans, and conduct training for Port Facility Security Officers.
- Necessary legislations have been incorporated into the Brunei Darussalam law.
